Preaching of the Word

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

'Singing as a soldier's moral force', that's the wonderful theme of this conference. And it is a good thing to sing together and lift his Name up high. Today in this sermon I'd like to underline to you the importance of #Selah in your life and worship of the Lord

So #Selah that is the key word I want to give you today. And that in response to Psalm 46. Among theologians also known as the Luther-Psalm. And if you love motorsports, then of course for you the number 46 is inseparable from the legendary Valentino Rossi. I did a bit of research, but unfortunately Valentino Rossi did not choose the number 46 because of the Psalm. It would have been nice though.

Most of you will know, that **#Selah** it is also a word from the Bible. The word Selah appears a total of 74 times in the Bible. Of which 71 times in the book of Psalms. And three more times in by the prophet Habaquq.

And you probably didn't hear it just now, but it also appears three times in this beautiful Psalm we just read: Psalm 46. Most Bible interpreters assume that the word "Selah" is some kind of clue to the people who were to musically accompany the Psalm. And especially also for the conductor or "choirmaster".

If you can read sheet music yourself, you know that sometimes above a piece there is a word like 'Allegro' or 'Adagio' or 'Amaroso' or 'Fortissimo.' And then you know that the piece in front of you should be played "joyfully," or "slowly and sensitively," or "lovingly" or just "very loudly".

Most Bible interpreters assume, that the word 'Selah' is an indication of a short rest. Not to go too fast. Not to play too fast. And to let the meaning of the words you have just sung come to you and be impressed by God. If the Psalms and the Bible were written today, it probably would have said something like "just chill for a moment". That short rest didn't come naturally for the readers or the singers of the Psalm. Hence the musical instruction. As if God is saying, "You could use a little #Selah in your life right now. Listen. Stand still. And chill.

And I think that doesn't just apply to the Israelites long ago. You and you and I could also use a little more #Selah in our lives. That applies anyway, I think, to your daily life. Which for most of us in Europe and maybe also in Africa everyday life is busy, busy, busy. And I don't know about you. But that busy and full by-the-week life, also has a lot of impact on how you shape your life with God.

Personally: Prayer and Bible reading often have to be quick and in between. Just five or ten minutes. And the world moves on again. On to the next activity. But also as a church-congregation. Just look at the way we design many church services together. So often they are ... busy and full. And it has its beautiful sides, of course. But I think there are also dangers in it. Namely, that we get too carried away.

And also that, as a pastor, you stand between God and your congregation with your words and your stories, as it were. Too many words. Too little **#Selah**. Too little time to be impressed by God together and be in His presence.

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Think about what it's like when there is someone in your life you love. Then you know that no relationship is enough with words alone. Loving each other involves all your senses, all your mind, all your feelings and all your imagination. Your relationship with God and with the Lord also needs that. It is, after all, a love relationship.

That is also what Jesus Himself did. If you know the Bible, you undoubtedly know how Jesus lived his life with a few sacred habits. For example, He knew a set regularity of going to synagogue on the Sabbath. And He also had the habit of regular retreats. Away from the crowds of people who wanted something from Him. To be alone with God. Jesus had #Selah in His life. Because He knew: 'Inner empty, tired and just busy people cannot distribute God's love

I can only distribute to people if I let myself be filled with His Spirit again and again.

If you have a desire to become more like Jesus. For yourself. Or if you want to share God's love in your city, your town or with your colleagues in the military.

Then it is good to follow Him in that too. Jesus-followers are people, who know about stopping. Who know about **#Selah**.

Some time ago I read an interview about with pastor Arjan Plaisir. From 2008 to 2016, he was the president-pastor of the biggest protestant church in the Netherlands. Above the interview was "Stop this endless ranting in the church".

So you understand, my curiosity was piqued. A little further on, he then says, "You know, the church can become a business. You're busy with your church habits, but the piety is gone. And then suddenly you wonder: Is there still depth in this, is there still the urge to worship in this, is our church still a place of devotion? Do we allow the emptiness in the church, the silence in which God speaks to us? Do we dare tears of emotion in the church, tears of repentance? Or is it all polished, beautiful phrases, beautiful liturgy, measured, throbbing - but there is no place for the cry from the heart". I think he longs for something like #Selah.

That's also why Jesus took a loaf of bread one night, broke it and distributed it to his disciples. And why He also later took a cup of wine and passed it around. He wanted His disciples, when He would soon go to His Father, not just to tell and preach about His miracles, healings and teaching. But He also wanted them and their disciples to have something to look at, something to hold, to taste. To become still for a moment. And to marvel at the goodness of God. That He would rather see His Son die than you.

But how do you do that? How do you find more **#Selah** in your life? I believe Psalm 46 gives us some short powerful pointers for that. For that, you need to know that the Psalm was probably written a stressful time.

Jerusalem is surrounded by hostile armies. No one can get in or out of the city anymore. People in the city are afraid, that their last hour has struck: "We're going to die!" they say to each other.

If there are people anywhere in the world right now who can empathize with this Psalm, it is the people of Ukraine. Last I saw how, Svyatoslav Vakarchuk, the singer of one of Ukraine's biggest bands, crawls behind a piano at the train station in Lviv and other places and sings encouragement to people: "The enemy will be defeated". Super powerful.

Even here in Jerusalem, during the siege of the city, there is someone who picks up a pen and writes a song. Psalm 46. To encourage people in Jerusalem and to let them experience a piece of #Selah.

The first verse (vs. 1-4) is about being safe with God. That He wants to be a safe refuge for you. He writes, "Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way / though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea / though its waters roar and foam / though the mountains tremble at it swelling"

When violent things happen, when the waves of life wash over you, you are often tempted -just as once the people in Jerusalem and later also disciples of Jesus- to look primarily at the water. At the circumstances. It can make you fearful and uncertain. Extraordinary to see how the writer of Psalm 46 urges you to keep your focus not on what happens to you, but on God. On Jesus. And then he says #Selah. Let that sink in.

In the second verse (vv. 5-8), the writer tries to impress upon you and you and me the presence of God. And that He is not a God far away, in a heaven far away from here, but that He is in our midst. He writes, "God is in the midst of her / she shall not be moved / God will help her when the morning dawn". In Jerusalem, in Old Testament times, people experienced this several times in special ways.

That God really was there.
Especially since the temple was there.

Christians believe that since the coming of Jesus, God no longer dwells in temples of stone, but that as a believer, you yourself are a temple of God. That He is with you. Dwelling in you. I know of quite a few people here in this place who experience God's presence for themselves, "Yes, that's about me". But it can also happen that you don't have that; and that you are in church this morning, but you just feel far away from God. And maybe struggling with God, but haven't surrendered yet. And to get there, my brother my sister, you need #Selah.

An Eastern Orthodox bishop once told the following story, "There was an old man who was in the habit of spending hours in church. At one point his friends asked him what he was doing there all that time. 'I am praying,' he replied. 'Oh, said his friends, 'then you must have a lot to ask God.' Somewhat surprised, the old man said, "I'm not asking God anything at all. 'But, then, what are you doing there all this time?" they asked. He replied, 'I sit and look at God and God sits and looks at me.' That is #Selah my brother and sister, and I hope and pray the Lord will give that to you.

And finally, in the last verse (vs. 9-12), He puts you on notice of the power of God: "Come and see what the Lord has done", he writes. "Be still and know that I am God'. This is about how many people in Jerusalem thought, that they themselves had to defeat that army at the gates,

that the future of the city of peace was in their hands. In their arms. And when I think about it, I do recognize myself.

Precisely also as a Christian, and certainly as a pastor, I feel that I have much to do. That the future of the church (and the world) is in my hands. But does the writer here say "Ho, stop. Cease the struggle. #Selah". Don't you remember and don't' you realize that God is fighting for you? That it's not your church, but His church? That this is all about Him? And if being honest, is indeed something I often forget. To get back there. Back to the heart of worship, I and together we need more #Selah.

We are now well together here on the RIMP as Christians from all kind of places. I hope you will want to think about whether and how you might allow more **#Selah** into your life in the coming period.

Imagine if every week at set time.
Let's say every Monday at 12h00,.
we would just sit back for a
moment and pray for example in
our hearts, the Lord's Prayer. And
that would be cool to know that
everywhere in the world there are
brothers and sisters praying with
you at the same time. A little piece
of #Selah in your life.

And I hope and pray that He may give you more moments like that in the time ahead. And that you may allow this stillness to give you new peace, joy and blessing and thus quiet your restlessness. Because, my brother, my sister, He has already done everything for you. Like, Jesus said, It is finished (Amen)
